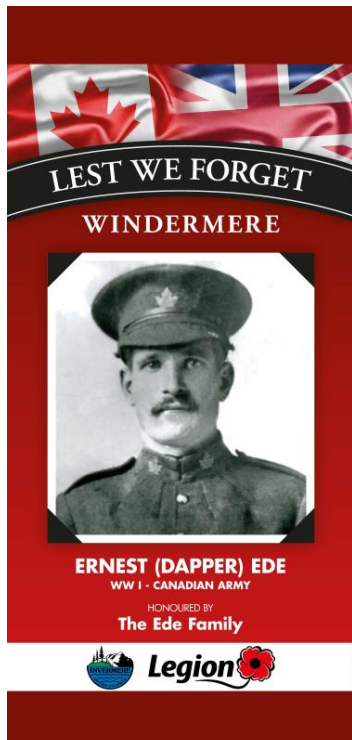


EDE, ERNEST (DAPPER)



Dapper Ede was born Feb. 10, 1891 in Liphook, Hampshire, England, and came to Canada in 1912 to work for William Heap Holland in Fairmont Hot Springs. He enlisted with the Canadian Army's Fifty-Fourth Battalion in World War One and was wounded at Passchendaele. He married Winnifred in England, where Heather and Ronald were born before the family returned to the valley in 1923. Four more children, Joyce, Eleanor, Gordon, and Myrtle, were born in Invermere. Dapper established a market garden farm in Windermere where most area residents purchased their Christmas turkeys. He died in 1972 and is buried in Windermere.
