
YOUNG, FREDERICK BENJAMIN



Born Jan. 21, 1867 in Chester, England, Frederick served in the Second Boer War as Captain in the British Army and later immigrated here, purchasing property on the Toby Benches as a Columbia Valley Irrigated Fruitlands farmer in 1912. His wife Mary bore him two sons, Clement and George, who tragically were drowned. The Youngs returned to England, where Frederick served as a Major in World War One. He was taken prisoner in 1914 and remained in a prison camp for four years. After the war, they returned to the valley and had two daughters: Phyllis and Helen. Frederick lived on his own property until he died in 1931.
